HOOFNZ Natural Hoof Care Practitioner Certificate Information

Trainees must be financial members of HOOFNZ.

The yearly membership subscription, due in August of each year is \$30.

HOOFNZ members pay a reduced fee at selected clinics and lectures.

Membership also entitles Trainees who have advanced through their training to have their contact details listed on the Trimmer Locator List at www.hoofnz.org.nz

Please be aware that any Trainee or Certified Trimmer can be removed from the Locator List at anytime if they are found to be trimming invasively, causing harm or distress to an equine or their owner, or representing HOOFNZ in a negative manner.

Introduction to Natural Hoof Care Clinic \$300 (March)

This is a 2 day course with HOOFNZ approved New Zealand or International clinicians only. Unless otherwise stated, the clinic fee is to be paid directly to the person conducting the clinic. Fees are paid with the clinic registration. Subjects covered include;

- How the equine hoof functions, internal structures etc.
- Recognising detrimental hoof distortion/healthy hoof patterns.
- Diet related hoof issues, lifestyle options for equines that improve health and soundness.
- How balanced trimming can benefit horses with a range of common hoof problems; ringbone, navicular, laminitis etc.
- How the use of hoof boots/pads can improve hoof form and comfort in horses with compromised feet.
- Wild horse hoof wear patterns and living conditions and how they relate to the domestic horse.
- The impact structural and postural issues can have on the hooves and vice versa.
- Safe horse handling practices.
- How to trim equine hooves in a non-invasive manner.

HOOFNZ Training Manual and Test Sheets \$50

The training manual will be available for purchase at the *Introduction to Natural Hoof Care Clinic*. The purpose of the training manual is to provide a general guideline for people who would like to become professional hoof care providers for equines in New Zealand.

The manual is not a stand alone guide but complements HOOFNZ training clinics. It does not replace veterinary medicine or the advice of equine professionals. HOOFNZ does not condone invasive hoof trimming that may cause pain or harm to equines. All HOOFNZ Trainees are advised to contact the appropriate equine professional if they suspect that an animal they encounter may be suffering mentally or physically.

Observation Day \$30

This is a day for the Trainee to travel with a professional HOOFNZ Trimmer and Instructor to see how they conduct their business and enables the Trainee to pick up valuable information on trimming and horse handling.

Case Studies – no fee

Trainees will have a minimum of 6 months to complete 4 case studies of horses/donkeys they are trimming. The first Case Study needs to be completed and posted no later than one month after attendance at the Natural Hoof Care Clinic. Each case study will include before and after trim photos, an initial written assessment, which will include the name, age, sex of the horse, its known history, any lameness issues - past and present – a short overview of its lifestyle, riding, feed and past hoof care programme. Case studies can be of your own horses before and after a trim.

The photos should include front on, side on, and sole views of all 4 hooves.

Side and front views of the forelimbs.

Side and rear views of the hind limbs.

Equine Nutrition \$100 (August)

1 day lecture with Lucy Waldron covering the following subjects;

- Equine digestive physiology.
- Basic nutrients.
- Raw materials used in horse feeds.
- Creating a ‘complete’ horse diet and feeding for work level.
- Grass’s; Kikuyu, paspalum & endophytes.
- Paddock maintenance.
- Analyzing feed and forage.
- Meeting the specific nutritional needs of horses, ponies and miniatures.
- Diets for Equine Metabolic Syndrome, Cushing’s and Laminitis.

Hoof Boot Course \$80 (October)

Distal Limb Anatomy Clinic \$150 (November)

1 day course with Sandy Hegh BVSc, assisted by Carol Wilson, takes participants through a step by step dissection of equine cadavers from cannon bone to hoof that includes removal of the hoof capsule to closely examine the inner structures of the foot. The purpose of the clinic is to familiarize the Hoof Care Practitioner with the superficial and deep anatomy of the distal limb of the horse. Explanation of microscopic structures of the hoof, along with pointers on how to read hoof radiographs, instills a deeper understanding of the equine distal limb for those interested in broadening their knowledge base.

Introduction to Saddle Fit (January) \$120

One day clinic with Anne Kershaw. This clinic is not formulated to qualify the Trainee as a saddle fitter but rather to bring a better understanding of how restrictive saddles adversely influence motion. This can give you, as a trimmer, more information on hoof wear patterns.

Mentorship x3 -\$100 each day

3 separate days spent with 3 different certified HOOFNZ Instructors. These can be the Trainee's choice taken from the list of approved Instructors on the HOOFNZ website Training Clinics page. The Trainee travels with the Instructor, trimming some of the Instructor's clients' horses. Before a Mentorship Day is booked, the Trainee must be able to complete a *Maintenance Trim* within at least 30 minutes and be able to comfortably trim a minimum of five horses in one day. This is a practical training day where the trainee follows the trimming guidelines of the Instructor. The Instructor will also be responsible for taking the trainee through the safety aspects of working with horses. The Mentorship Day fee is paid to the Instructor when the Mentorship day is booked. Customer Feedback Forms

The Customer Feedback Sheets will be given to the Trainee once they have built a small regular client base. The forms are to be filled out by the Client and posted back to the Training Coordinator. The Trainee is not permitted to view the completed forms. The information is confidential and between the Client and the Training Coordinator and documents your progress as a Professional Trimmer.

Hoof Pathology – price to be advised

Lecture in Power Point format covering the cause, effect and trim options of various hoof deformations. Included in this course is a Hoof Pathology CD and Exam.

Final Audit - \$350

The final audit involves a full day spent with an approved HOOFNZ Instructor. The Trainee will be working with their own clients' horses and will be assessed on customer relations, efficiency, formation sharing ability, safe and considerate horse handling, trimming and horse/hoof assessment skills. Time will also be spent assessing the Trainee's depth of knowledge, experiences, confidence, competence and professionalism as a Natural Hoof Care Practitioner using the following quality scale;

- 1 insufficient
- 2 moderate
- 3 good
- 4 excellent

There is a set fee for the Final Audit but the Trainee may also need to cover the travel costs of the Instructor.

Certification

If the Trainee completes all of the above criteria and proves him/herself to be a capable, knowledgeable, honest, dependable person with an excellent work ethic and the ability to skillfully trim equine hooves for strength and health without causing trauma or stress and show a clear desire to continue to broaden their knowledge of natural hoof care and healthy horse keeping practices then they will receive a Certificate of Attainment from

the Hoofcare Organisation of New Zealand and become a HOOFNZ Certified Natural Hoof Care Practitioner.
